Pincus recalls commencing her full time law course in 1976 at the Australian National University (ANU); returning to the Federal Public Service in the Office of Women's Affairs for a short stint in 1980; working as an Associate for High Court Justice Lionel Murphy in 1982; returning to the Public Service in 1983 to work in a legislative capacity dealing with law reform within various government departments; her work on the establishment and chairmanship of the National Food Authority; her return to Sydney in 1995 and her work as a consultant on various projects; her field work for the international body Food and Agricultural Organization (FAO).
