In this interview Flannery recalls aspects of her life in South Australia; her stint at Oxford University studying the history of architecture; her discovery of Paquita Delprat's letters to her future husband, Antarctic explorer & Professor of Geology at Adelaide University, Sir Douglas Mawson, gaining access to Mawson's replies to the letters; her work in the field of folk history, radio; her work in progress on older women, as well as the role of women today from the perspective of the traditional women.
